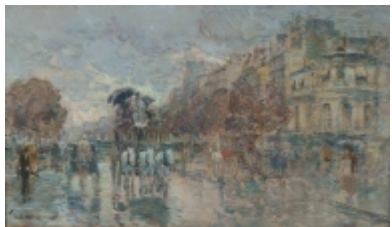
In *Trapper's Last Stand*, the cowboy is **shooting** at Indians, but he is also aiming directly **at the viewer**. This is important because it means that the artist, Charles Russell, was intending the viewer of the painting to **see events through the eyes of Native Americans**.

Our oldest painting in the Gallery is Jacob van Ruisdael's *House by a Road on a Wooded Slope*, dating to the 17th century.



Antoine Louis Barye named this statue *Elk*, even though it is clearly a moose.

**Albert Bierstadt** painted *Emigrants Resting at Sunset*.  
Paul Revere made five pieces in our Colonial Silver collection: **the teapot, a pitcher, a set of spoons, Cans (or mugs), and a porringer**.  
There are **four elephants** in the last tapestry.



The portrait of Martha Washington was painted by the famous **Rembrandt Peale**.

**Sally Farnham** sculpted *Paleolithic Woman*, which is on display in the Frederic Remington Gallery.



This is Frederic Remington's *Bronco Buster*.

The Gallery is named for **Mr. R.W. Norton, Sr.**

Mary Cassatt was one of our Impressionists. **Childe Hassam** is the other. He painted *Les Grands Boulevards, Paris*

Auguste Rodin's two marble sculptures are entitled *Head of a Young Girl* and *Fallen Caryatid Carrying Her Stone*.

Giovanni Piranesi has **16 etchings** on display.

"Cowboy Artists" on display at the Norton:  
**Charles Schreyvogel, ADM Cooper, Harry Jackson, Alexander Proctor, John Mix Stanley, Gutzon Borglum, Peter Moran**

The bird on display in J.J. Audubon's *Birds of America* is the **Snake Bird** or *Anhinga*.  
The Native American Chiefs Charles Russell painted portraits of are **Chief Joseph** and **Chief Sitting Bull**.
